

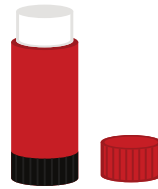
HORSE LEG ANATOMY CUT AND PASTE ACTIVITY

Now that we have looked at the parts of the horse's leg,
let's put our knowledge to the test!

YOU WILL NEED:



SCISSORS

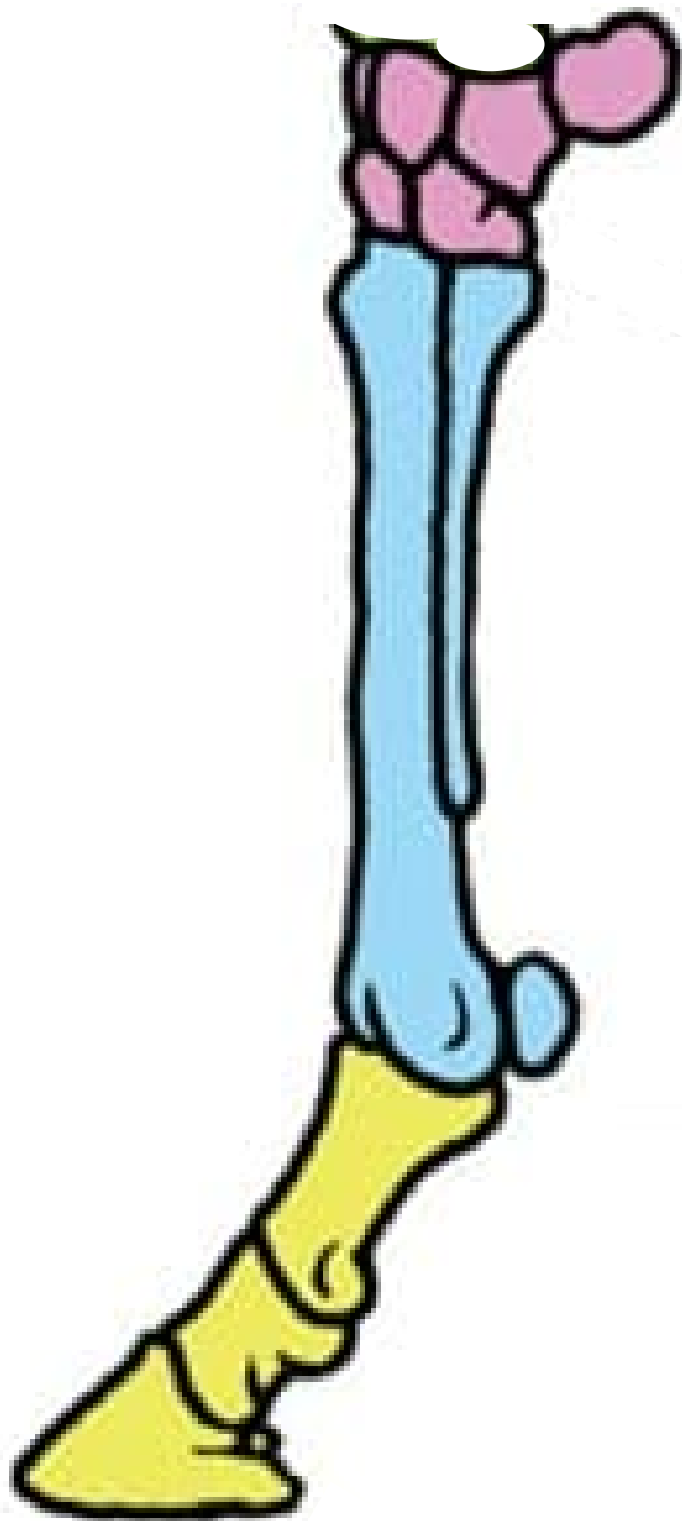


GLUE STICK

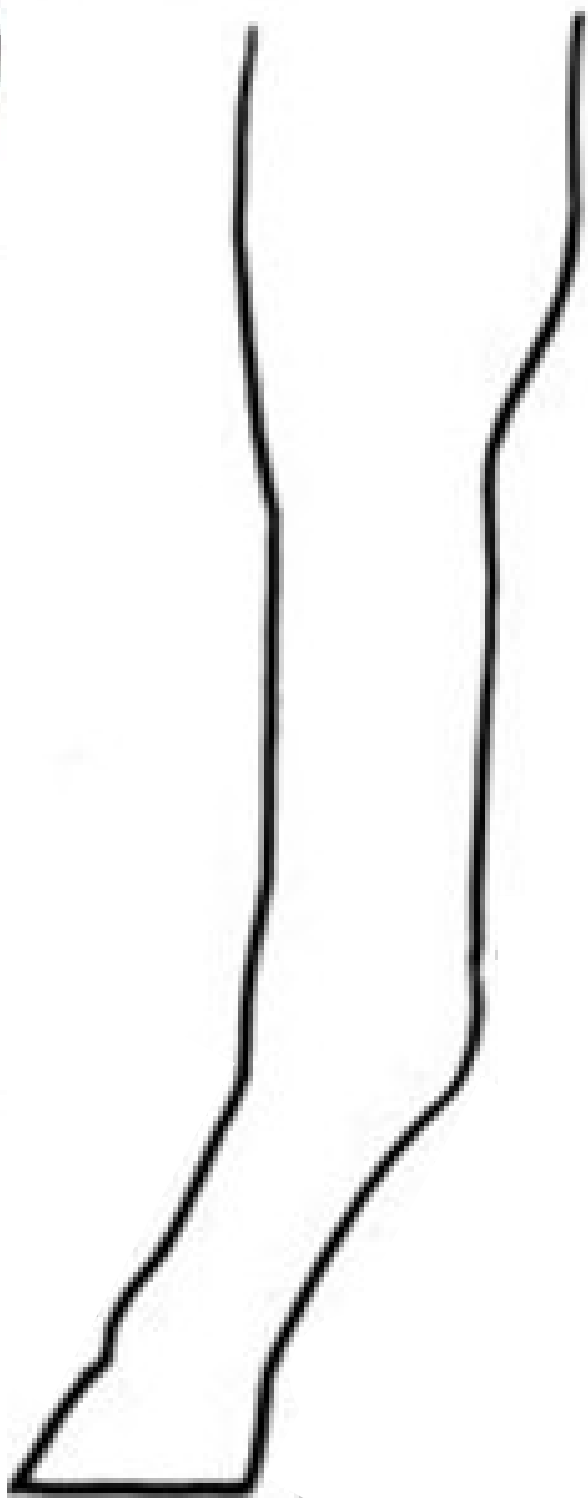
DIRECTIONS:

1. Cut out the **yellow** bones. After you cut out the phalanges, paste them into the correct spot of the blank horse leg.
 - These bones are the pasterns and coffin bones. They can also be called the phalanges and are the same bones we have in our fingers.
2. Cut out the **blue** bone. In horses we call this bone the cannon bone or the metacarpus. This is the same bone we have in our hands. Paste the cannon bone into the correct spot on the horse's front leg.
3. Cut out the **pink** bones. These bones are the horse's carpal bones. We call these bones the horse's knee, but in humans these are the same bones as our wrist. Paste the carpal bones where the horse's knee is in the drawing.
